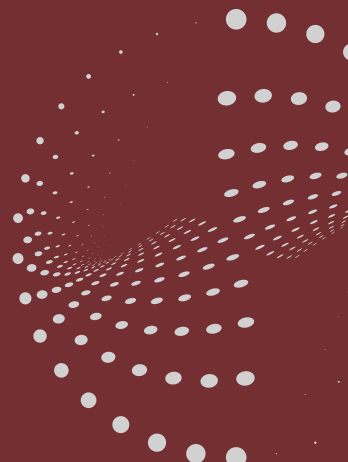

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# Context



## What's happening in Lebanon?

- The ceasefire has been extended by three weeks, but the situation remains fragile and unstable.
- Around 1,049,000 people remain displaced across Lebanon, with limited conditions for safe return, and 121,126 in 642 collective shelters.
- Despite the ceasefire, hostilities continue, with shelling, airstrikes, and restrictions on civilian movement.
- Since March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2489 people have been killed and 7719 injured.
- Healthcare services are severely impacted, with 6 hospitals and 51 PHCCs closed and over 147 attacks recorded.
- Infrastructure damage is widespread, affecting roads, bridges, electricity, water, and telecommunications.
- Food prices increased by at least 6%, worsening economic hardship and increasing risks of exploitation (e.g., high rents).
- Nearly 500,000 vulnerable people have received cash assistance, but humanitarian needs remain extremely high.

# Our Response by Activities

## Essential Relief Support

Distribution of core relief items including mattresses, blankets, sleeping mats, and water to help families create safer living conditions inside temporary shelters.

## Food & Basic Daily Needs

Provision of hot meals, food items, and eating utensils to support displaced families with their daily nutrition and basic household needs.

## Health Services

Delivery of primary healthcare consultations through the primary healthcare center and mobile medical teams reaching people in shelters and host locations.

## Hygiene & Dignity Assistance

Distribution of hygiene and dignity kits to support personal care and maintain dignity for women, children, and vulnerable individuals.

## Energy & Infrastructure Support

Installation of solar lamps, provision of generators, and fuel to improve lighting and ensure safer living environments in displacement locations.

## Psychosocial Support & Protection

Organization of psychosocial support sessions, psychological first aid activities, and safe spaces for children to help families cope with crisis-related stress.

## Community Engagement & Outreach

Ongoing support through community activities, support calls, and field visits to identify needs and connect families with available assistance.

## Volunteer Mobilization

Coordination of volunteers and field teams working across multiple locations to deliver rapid humanitarian assistance to displaced families.



## Delivering Essential Healthcare in Times of Crisis

During the recent crisis in Lebanon, Makhzoumi Foundation mobilized its healthcare network to ensure that displaced families and vulnerable communities continued to receive essential medical services.

### The Primary Healthcare Center (PHCC)

With the support of the MoPH PHC Network and partners such as PUAMI, the PHCC ensures continuity of care throughout the crisis. A dedicated team of doctors, nurses, and healthcare professionals provide a wide range of services including medical consultations, laboratory testing, radiology services, routine vaccinations, and access to essential medications.

### Primary Healthcare Satellite Units (PSUs)

To ensure that healthcare reaches communities where it is needed most, Makhzoumi Foundation deploys its mobile teams to support displaced families in shelters and host communities. They provide accessible primary healthcare services, including medical consultations, health screenings, and follow-up care for non-communicable diseases such as diabetes and hypertension. Special attention is given to elderly patients and individuals with chronic conditions.
